INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. The cutter can be opened with one hand by drawing the end of the handles over thigh.
- 2. Either the cutter or the pipe must be turned (approximately 1/4 turn) for the cutter to cut most pipe properly. No turning is necessary to cut rubber hose or soft tubing.
- CUTTING POLYETHYLENE: Squeeze and rotate the handles above.
- 4. CUTTING PVC PIPE: Start as illustrated above. Squeeze only hard enough-while rotating the handles to allow the blade to penetrate the pipe wall. If the blade has not penetrated through the wall in 3/4" to 1" travel, **BACK THE CUTTER UP** and repeat the cut in scored groove. This should be necessary only when the blade is dull or cutting 1-1/4" I.D. pipe. Once the blade has penetrated the pipe wall, a short up and down **rocking motion** on the handles (with little or no squeeze) will eliminate rotating the cutter or turning the pipe and provide a better cut. Excessive squeezing can cause some pipe to break.
- 5. USE CAUTION when cutting BRITTLE or COLD PVC PIPE. The pipe may break and cause a nick in the blade edge, making it necessary to resharpen or replace the blade.
- For long blade life we recommend the following:
 DO NOT twist or pull the cutter handles parallel to the pipe.
 DO NOT snap-cut PVC pipe. Cut slowly at the end of the cut, rotating handles, not squeezing.
 DO NOT attempt to cut wire, metal or anything harder than plastic.
- 7. TO SHARPEN BLADE: Separate the handles by removing pivot screw. Start with a coarse hone. With the beveled portion of the blade flat on the hone, work the blade until a small burr forms on the opposite side you are working. Then work the other side the same way until you feel a small burr on the opposite side. Switching to a fine hone or a ceramic rod (using alternate strokes on opposite sides) stroke the hone at approximately 14° as though you were trying to slice it. When the burrs are gone and the blade feels sharp, it is ready to use again
- 8. **CAUTION:** BLADE IS VERY SHARP. KEEP AWAY FROM CHILDREN.
